LCW – The LCW met on Friday. January 6, 2023, to discuss plans for the year. The group decided to go forward with a plan for a Shrove Tuesday Sloppy Joe dinner on February 21, 2023. A Shrove Tuesday planning meeting will be held on Sunday January 22, 23023 at 11 a.m. to finalize plans for the dinner. It was decided to have a signup sheet for church members to sign up so that the committee will know how many people to plan for. In further discussion, it was suggested that we plan for a Salad Supper in the spring and a picnic in the fall.

Worship and Music Committee -

- The Worship and Music Committee met on January 11th.
- There will be two services on Ash Wednesday one in the morning and another in the evening! Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday will have one service. Holden Evening will be held during Lent.
- Discussion was held about having the Outdoors Service on Wednesday evening during the from May to September.
- There will be a meeting following service on February 5th to discuss ushering. Everyone is invited to attend if you are interested in ushering.
- Next Meeting is set for February 8th at 11:30.

RIC – Due to the holidays, no meeting was held in December. In January Andy Buda joined the committee. The committee continued to discuss the book Rescuing Jesus: How People of Color, Women, and Queer Christians are Reclaiming Evangelicalism focusing on the chapter regarding Racial Awareness.Further considerations of the committee will focus on visiting churches to become familiar with how people of color, and queer Christians worship and developing a message that welcomes and affirms all people in regard to their gender expression, gender identity, and sexual orientation.

Finance – December donations were, in a word, phenomenal. The \$66,506 total is highest December not only in the last ten years, but in the last 20 years by just under \$14,000. more than doubling a very good 2021 (\$32,878) by \$33,628 and exceeding a very good 2020 (\$35,717) by \$30,789. December expenses (\$17,281) were lower than 2021 by \$871 and higher than 2020 by \$2,203. December operations generated a \$49,225 surplus. The year-to-date deficit was eliminated, and the year ended with a \$306 surplus. Given the exceptional deficit that was overcome, the results are truly remarkable. At the end of twelve months, 100.00% of the year, 95.6% of the budget was spent. Most categories that exceeded 95.6% were highly seasonal. As in prior years the percent expended is several percent lower than the completed portion of the year. Donations through December recorded in Shepherd's Staff agree in total and by fund with the financial records. No pass-through funds are overdrawn. Six on-line donations totaling \$788 were received by the last counters report date (12/30/22). There were no Thrivent donations (YTD there have been 3 Thrivent donations totaling \$222). The balance sheet remains strong. There is no long-term debt. Total assets have increased by \$1,404 since 12/31/21. The increase is due to Capital Improvement donations more than offsetting resurfacing the parking lot and the Ministry Fund operational surplus.

Property

- The new water cooler has been received and installation is in progress. The old water cooler has been removed and the rough-in work for the new water cooler is in progress.
- The bench made from recycled plastic bags has been received and assembled by Pastor Adam. It will be installed by the playground as soon as a secure location is determined by the property committee.
- Work on the audio/visual system in the Sanctuary continues. To date the new ethernet line has been temporarily connected to the present location of the A/V desk at the southeast side of the Sanctuary. The remaining work includes moving the A/V desk to its new location and running the camera feeds to the desk. When completed we will have cameras located in the northeast and southeast corners of the Sanctuary.
- A new 85" high-definition TV has been purchased for the Sanctuary to be installed on the wall behind the lectern. Installation planning will begin the morning of January 23rd.
- The Seventh Day Adventist congregation has purchased new wireless microphones to be used in the Sanctuary.
- Karl Obien has joined the Lord of life Property Committee.

Council Highlights

- Bingo night was a success, we had 38 attend and a good time was had by all. In addition, good will offering raised \$150
- Attendance is averaging around 46 in-person on Sundays
- Pastor Adam will be hosting a Paint with Pastor event. More details to come.
- April 16th will hold a viewing of Jesus Christ Superstar as the service. We will have a viewing of the original version of the movie and will only serve communion.
- Council approved the 2023 budget to be submitted for the annual meeting
- Ushering Training Scheduled for February 5th after the service

- Lent Services are in the works of planning
